Answer the following questions to determine how safe and secure your home is. The more times you answer 'yes', the harder you make it for criminals to target you and your home.

Do you have secure locks and deadbolts or deadlocks fitted?

Do you have security screens on doors and windows?

Does your house have an automatic light timer or sensor light?

Do you leave lights on when you go out at night?

Are the entrances to your home well lit?

Is your home fitted with a well maintained alarm?

Are your garage, shed and gates kept locked?

Are your tools and ladders stored away?

Is the meter box locked?

Are your contents and valuables marked for easy identification?

Have you photographed and recorded property serial numbers?

Is there a phone close by with emergency numbers handy?

### What is Neighbourhood Watch?
