

VEHICLES, GARAGES & CAR PARKS

- Hide or remove all property in your vehicle, even spare coins and sunglasses.
- Always lock and secure your vehicle.
- Regularly check both your number plates are correct and still attached.
- Always lock up your motorbike, scooter or bicycle correctly, use a good quality lock and strong cable/chain.
- All gates / access to premises should be shut and locked at all times.
- Wait for the gates / doors behind you to close before moving off.
- Stop vehicles no more than 1.5 car lengths inside the car park to prevent vehicles following without swiping in.
- Do not "caravan" into the car park – i.e. follow the vehicle in front.
- Be assertive. Be conscious of suspicious visitors who attempt to walk in behind you.

BUILDING/COMPLEX CONSIDERATIONS

- Does the building/complex have strategies for residents to follow regarding entering and exiting the complex/building. For example, are residents encouraged to ask for ID if someone has entered the building behind them?
- Is there a building “safe” word in case you are locked out and need access to the complex? A safe word helps identify you to other residents.
- Does your complex have CCTV and/or monitored alarms?
- Do you display security signage such as ‘CCTV Cameras in Operation?’
- Does your complex have a gate or boom gate across carpark entries?
- Is NHW an agenda item on established meetings such as Strata Management/Council of Owners to discuss:
 - Crime & social issues
 - Existing crime prevention strategies & what other strategies can be explored
 - Social events for residents to get to know each other



- Is there a digital communication network (group chat) to share information and get in touch with other residents quickly and efficiently? This is important for passing on information, warnings and tips.

There are many methods available such as texting, social media apps and emailing for exchanging information.

PERSONAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Have you marked your property or have serial numbers recorded?
- Is there a peephole in your front door?
- Are your doors & windows equipped with locks?
- For ground floor units/apartments do you keep your windows and doors locked even when you are at home?
- Are you aware of your surroundings and report all suspicious activity to Police?
- Do you have an alarm and personal CCTV?

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For all emergencies (Police, Fire or Ambulance). Where life or property is threatened or in danger.

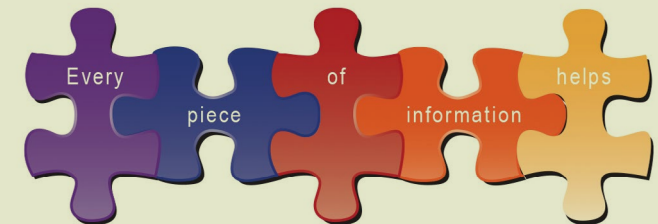
For all non-urgent Police attendance.
